Neighborhood Preservation Companies (NPCs) are community-based not-for-profit housing companies committed to revitalizing New York State's urban and suburban areas. NPCs are often the last line of support for individuals before living in a shelter or on the street. New York's NPCs provide a broad range of preservation and revitalization activities. NPCs receive funding through the Neighborhood Preservation Program (NPP). The amount allocated is determined by New York's budget each year.
